A Message from Reverend Greg

Dear Friends,

"I invite you, therefore, in the name of the Church, to the observance of a holy Lent, by self-examination and repentance; by prayer, fasting, and self-denial; and by reading and meditating on God's holy Word. And, to make a right beginning of repentance, and as a mark of our mortal nature, let us now kneel before the Lord, our maker and redeemer."

(Book of Common Prayer, Liturgy for Ash Wednesday, pg. 265)

Each year we hear this exhortation on how we might keep a Holy Lent. We know how challenging it is. For some, a part of you may want to yell at the top of our lungs, "Have we not suffered enough? Have we not endured more than our share?" Our year has been difficult and for many, their mourning is just beginning. For us who live in this country, the journey of Lent includes not only this on-going pandemic; it also includes the ugliness of racism, the real danger of global warming, domestic terrorist groups and misinformation being scattered countrywide. How can we not enter this Holy Season without self-examination, repentance, prayer, fasting and self-denial?

As a child and young adult, Lent was always the Season where we were encouraged to "sacrifice/give up" something that would be difficult. Whether it was food, sugar, carbonated drinks, coffee/tea, red meat, etc. the intent was a good one, but it lacked one thing: self-examination. After the forty days were finished, what would I have learned about myself that would help another human being?

In biblical days, when the Israelites sinned, to show how sorry they were, they would cut up their clothes (remember *rend* means to tear) to show God how sorry they were for their actions. The Prophet Joel reminds us to 'tear open our hearts' and examine if they are attuned to God: "*Yet even now, says the Lord, return to me with all your heart, with fasting, with weeping, and with mourning; rend your hearts and not your clothing. Return to the Lord, your God.*" (Joel 2:12-13; NRS version). I pray we all rend our hearts to discern the road that we must travel to Easter.

"REPENTANCE 2021: TURNING BACK TO GOD HERE AND NOW

The invitation of Lent to repent and return to the Lord is the same every year, but we come to this invitation this year in the wake of the overlapping pandemics of COVID-19, racism, climate change and disinformation. How shall we answer the ancient invitation faithfully in this particular season of our common life?

The Cathedral Church of St. Paul in Boston invites everyone to take part in its annual Lenten Preaching Series, via Zoom, on Thursdays at noon throughout Lent. This year's series lifts up voices of leaders who are fairly new to the greater Boston area or who have come to see the area anew. The sermons will be offered within the context of a brief service of noonday prayer.
